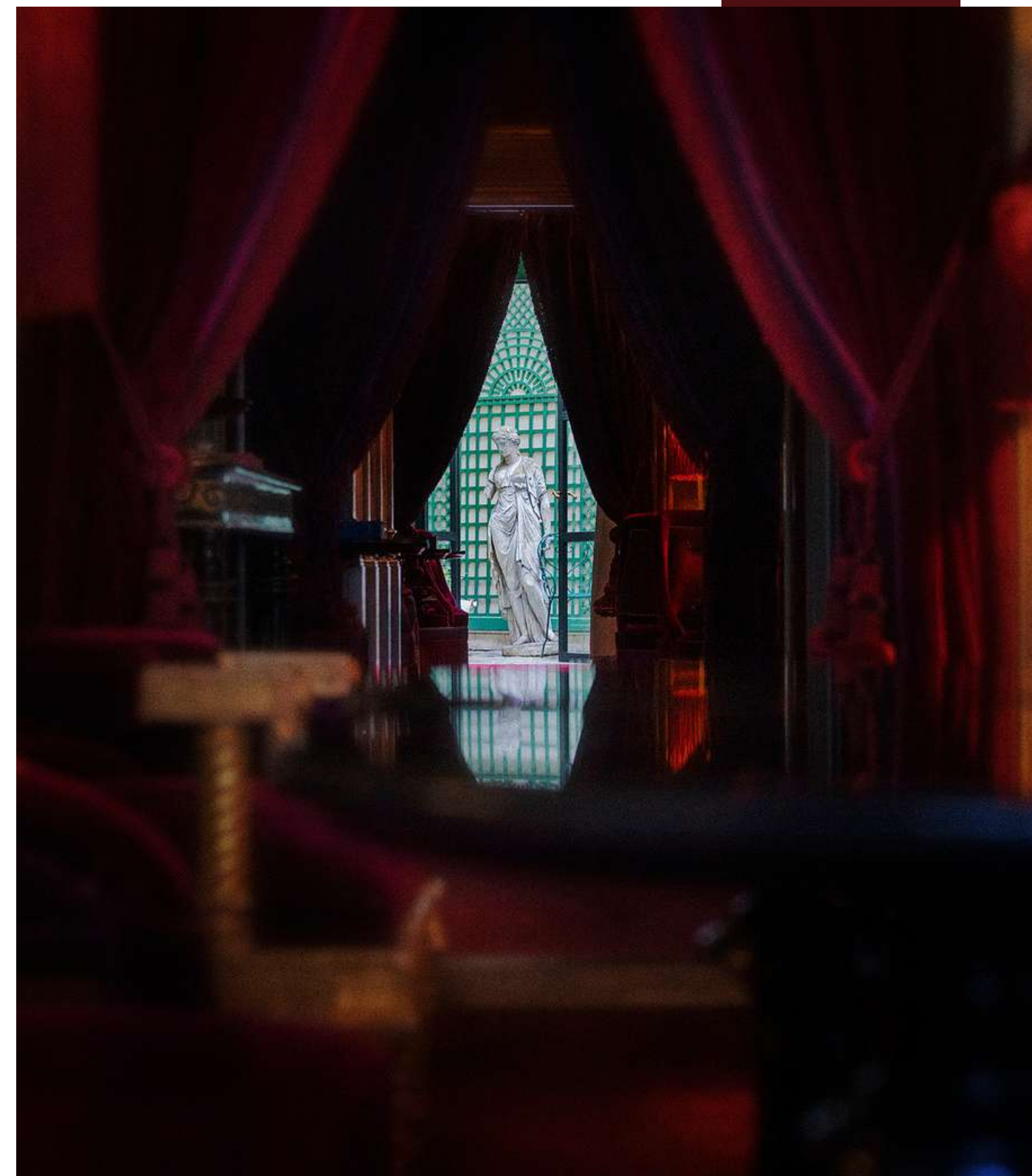

• LA MAISON SOUQUET •

The Collection Maisons Particulières consists of hotels designed as elegant mansions. Confidential and intimate, they reflect the spirit and soul of Paris. Privileging refined luxury over ostentatious, the houses invite to an experience of an extraordinary home, surrounded by the benevolent presence of a service that combines discretion and discernment. La Maison Souquet belongs to the Collection Maisons Particulières.

At the turn of the 19th and 20th centuries, brothels were the second home of the powerful and aesthetes. La Maison Souquet reproduces the sumptuous decor of one of them, a short distance from Montmartre and its famous mill. Behind a discreet facade, raised by two lanterns it reserves its luxury to the only initiates. La Maison Souquet is a confidential refuge, out of time, where it is good to immerse yourself in the splendour of the Belle Époque. The talent of Jacques Garcia restores here the mystery, the elegance, the exoticism, the sensuality and the incredible luxury of these establishments with well codified architecture. Small palace of hedonism 5 stars, the House Souquet reveals 20 rooms including 6 suites with unique decorations.





• THE DESIGNER •

Brilliant decorator, Jacques Garcia signs the decoration of the Maison Proust.

Trained at the Ecole des métiers d'art, the French decorator Jacques Garcia designed the decoration of mythical hotels, splendid private residences around the world, participated in the redevelopment of Louis XIV's private apartments at the Palace of Versailles or in the layout of the rooms devoted to 18th-century French furniture at the Louvre Museum.

His hotel creations include La Réserve, Hotel Costes and Maison Souquet in Paris, Villa Astor in Sorrento, Mamounia in Marrakech, Nomad (New York, Los Angeles), Metropole in Monte Carlo.

The collection currently has three institutions:

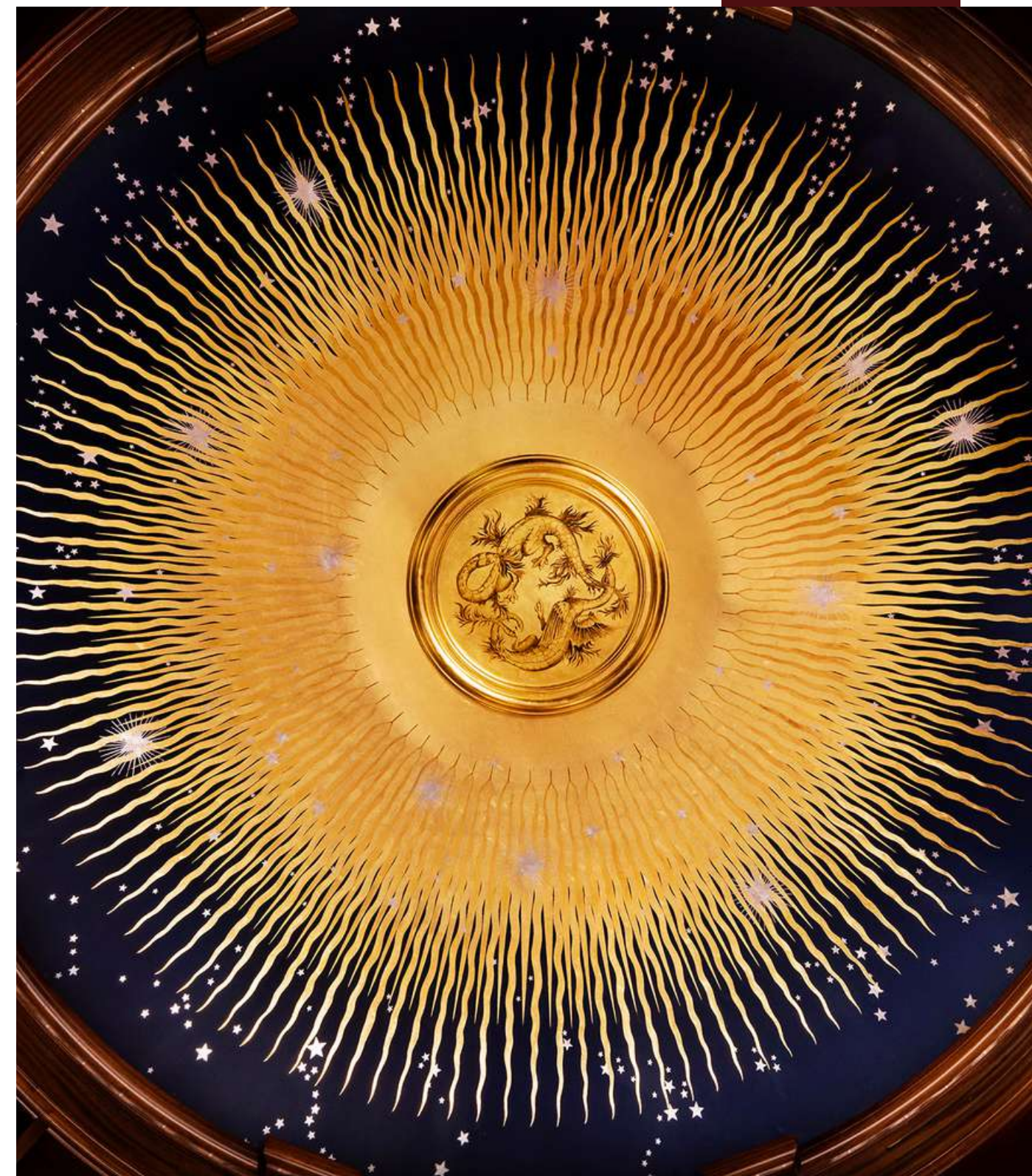
- Maison Souquet, 5 * hotel located in Montmartre

• MAISON PROUST •

Located in the heart of the Marais, Maison Proust is a privileged address to explore, on foot or by bike, the most beautiful places of the capital.

In a world subject to constant acceleration, Maison Proust celebrates the time of letting go, contemplation and change of scenery. By choosing this theme of the Belle Epoque, period with a very strong identity by its splendour and its taste for the arts, it has as its only vocation to offer its guests, to the rhythm of their desires, moments out of time.

After the opening of its doors on November 18, 2022, on the occasion of the centenary of the death of Marcel Proust, Maison Proust was recognized as an exceptional establishment and was among the winners of the 2023 Hot List of the Condé Nast Traveller, a list highlighting recent venues that raise the standards of hospitality through their unique style, ethics and quality service.





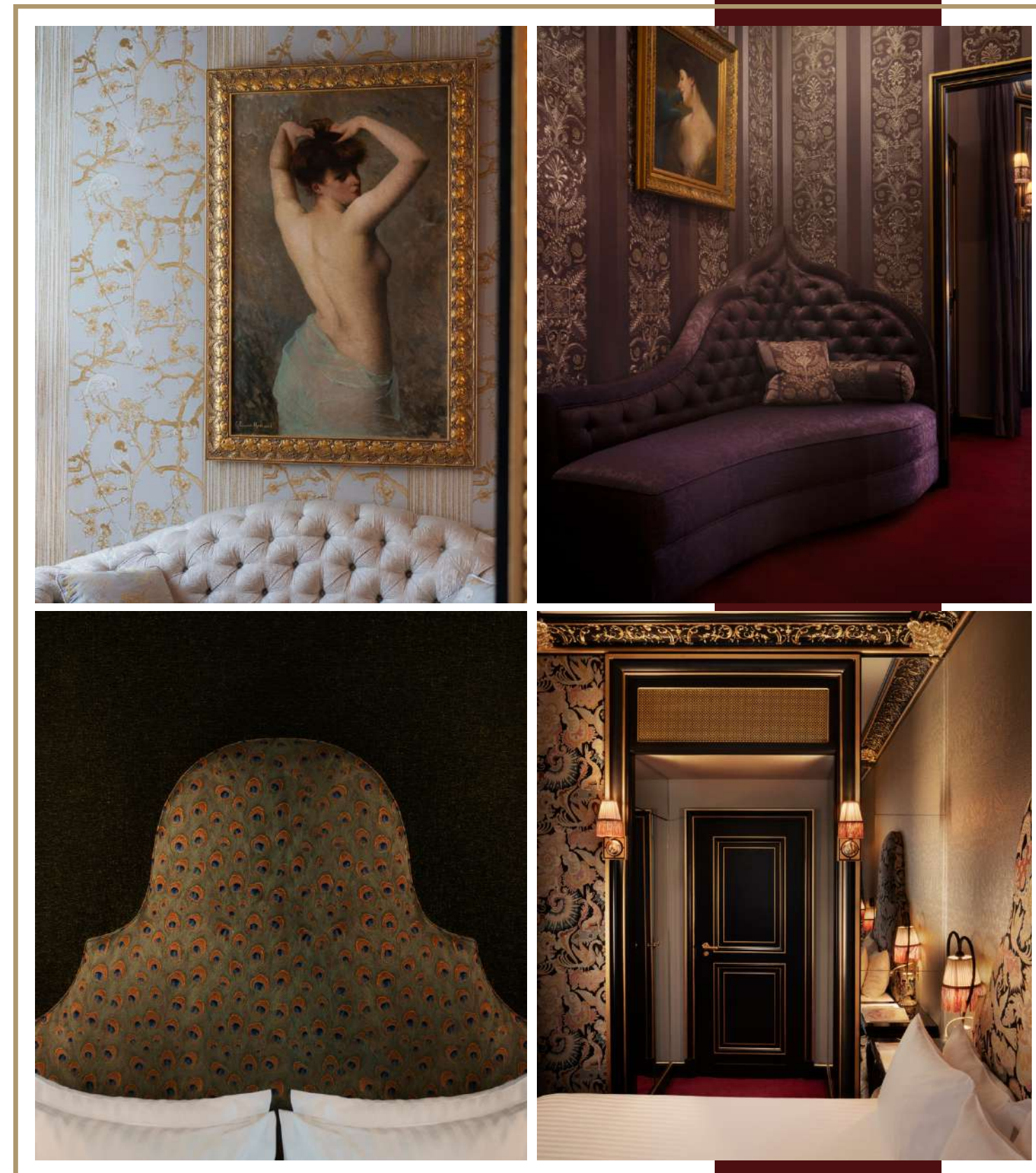

• ROOMS AND SUITES •

The fourteen rooms, six junior suites including the two apartments of the Maison Souquet pay tribute to the singular beauty of the courtesans whose name they take. Draped by two thousand meters of fabrics, they form cocoons with unique atmospheres.

Empire, Napoleon III, Indian, Chinese, Japanese or Art Deco, they play on the combinations of one hundred and twenty references of fabrics gathered during months of research.

The 203 for example, the so-called chamber of Rita wraps in the weaving of thousands of peacock feathers. Two doors further, that of Rose, summons the beautiful bizarre dear to Baudelaire. On the third and fourth floors, the same luxury is combined with larger volumes. The two junior suites of La Païva thus form an apartment whose collection of objects rivals that constituted for the junior suite Liane de Pougy. It has an original work by Armand-Albert Rateau, which sets the tone for a decor freely inspired by Jeanne Lanvin's apartment.

Within the Maison Souquet, three unique spaces will seduce you with their distinctive charm

The Winter Garden stretches along a tangled wall of ivy and jasmine, offering a view through its canopy to a cozy circle of sofas. An outdoor smoking room, decorated with a swan-shaped bench reminiscent of the Malmaison, invites you to relax.

The beating heart of the establishment, the bar, is adorned with the appearance of a library, with its imposing fireplace and its collection of ancient books. Hidden from the city, this intimate bar becomes the hotel's focal point, offering a variety of flavors to discover.

The Thousand and One Nights Lounge gracefully welcomes guests upon arrival. Inspired by Orientalism of the early twentieth century, it features majestic columns, delicate arcades and finely carved woodwork. Gilded elements, precious porcelain and shimmering stained glass complement this enchanting decor, skillfully fusing different styles to create a captivating atmosphere.



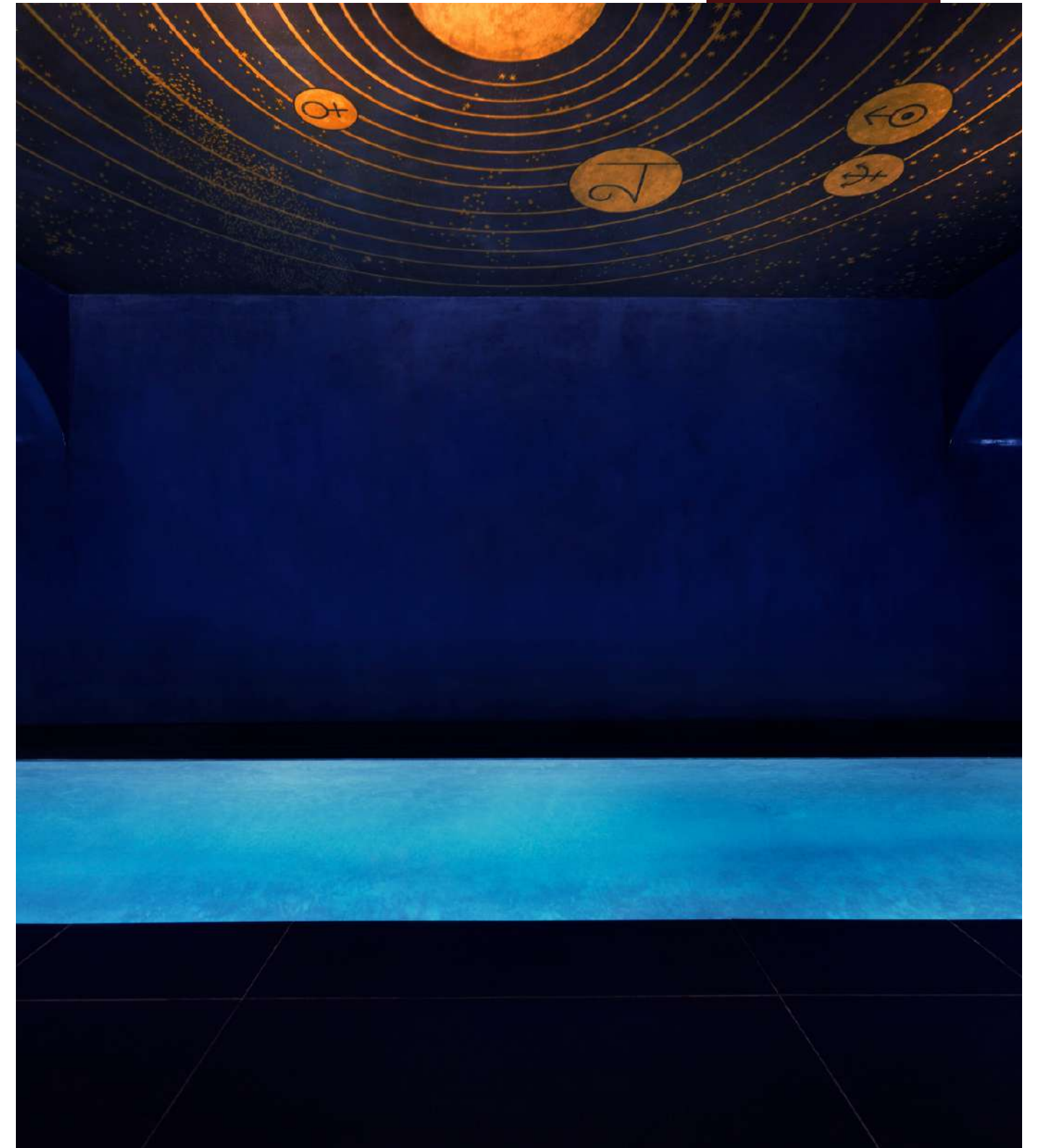


• THE SPA •

Nestled in a subdued alcove, the Maison Souquet's water room is the most magical place in the hotel.

Reserved for the exclusive use of guests who request the key, this secret spa is decorated with a celestial vault, whose golden stars shine on a cobalt blue sky.

They overlook a swimming pool of 10 meters and give the place a singular magic that extends to the hammam as in the adjoining treatment room.
